The Board of Trustees

Legal Status and Operation

The Board of Trustees of the McCall-Donnelly School District is the entity established by the state of Idaho to plan and direct all aspects of the district's operations to the end that students shall receive quality instruction geared to meet their individual and collective learning needs.

The Board of Trustees is made up of five (5) members, elected by the district's voters to three year terms and until successors are qualified. Trustees are selected from specific geographic zones and must reside in the zone they represent. Maps and descriptions showing trustee zones are maintained and available from the office of the superintendent.

The operations of the trustees are governed by their adopted policies and by the statutes of the State of Idaho. Policies are subject to those statutes and any part or portion contrary to statute is considered void and of no effect. Policies define the organization of the board and the manner by which it conducts official business and that facilitate district operations.

The Board of Trustees intends to organize and maintain the distinction between those activities appropriate to the legislative governing body and those administrative activities delegated to and performed by the superintendent and his/her staff. Functions of the trustees are defined as policy-making, appraisal, budget oversight and evaluation.
